He said: "I don't work."	simple present →	simple past	He said (that) he didn't work.
He said: "I am not working."	present progressive →	past progressive	He said (that) he wasn't working.
He said: "I will not work."	simple future →	would + infinitive	He said (that) he wouldn't work..
He said: "I will not be working."	future progressive →	would + progressive infinitive	He said (that) he wouldn't be working.
He said: "I'm not going to work."	going-to-future →	was/were + going to	He said (that) he wasn't going to work.
He said: "I would not work."	would →	would + perfect infinitive	He said (that) wouldn't have worked.
He said: "I would not be working."	would + present progressive infinitive →	would + perfect progressive infinitive	He said (that) he wouldn't have been working.
He said: "I didn't work."	simple past →	past perfect	He said (that) he hadn't worked.
He said: "I was not working."	past progressive →	past perfect progressive	He said (that) he hadn't been working.
He said: "I haven't worked."	present perfect →	past perfect	He said (that) he hadn't worked.
He said: "I haven't been working."	present perfect progressive →	past perfect progressive	He said (that) he hadn't been working.
He said: "I hadn't worked."	past perfect →	past perfect	He said (that) he hadn't worked.
He said: "I hadn't been working."	past perfect progressive →	past perfect progressive	He said (that) he hadn't been working.
He said: "I will not have worked."	future perfect →	would + perfect infinitive	He said (that) he wouldn't have worked.
He said: "I will not have been working."	future perfect progressive →	would + perfect progressive infinitive	He said (that) he wouldn't have been working.
He said: "I wouldn't have worked."	would + perfect infinitive →	would + perfect infinitive	He said (that) he wouldn't have worked.

He asked: Who is ill?	Fragewort ist Subjekt →		He asked who was ill.
He asked: What are you doing?	Inversion →	S V O →	He asked what you were doing.
He asked: What is wrong?	Fragewort ist Subjekt →		He asked what was wrong.
He asked: What are you talking about?	Inversion →	S V O →	He asked what you were talking about.
He asked: Who(m) are you talking to?	Inversion →	S V O →	He asked who(m) you were talking to.
He asked: With whom are you playing?	Inversion →	S V O →	He asked with whom you were playing.
He asked: Why have you done that?	Inversion →	S V O →	He asked why you had done that.
He asked: When will you come?	Inversion →	S V O →	He asked when you would come.
He asked: Where do you live?	Frage mit <b>to do</b> / Inversion →	S V O, <b>to do</b> fällt weg →	He asked where you live?
He asked: Are you coming tonight?	kein Fragewort, Inversion →	<b>if = ob</b> , S V O →	He asked if you were (are) coming tonight.
He asked: Is she ill?	kein Fragewort, Inversion →	<b>if = ob</b> , S V O →	He asked if she was ill.
