Bei den Vollverben erfolgt die Bildung der **Verneinung** und der **Frage** mit **to do**.

Bei **Hilfs-/Modalverben** erfolgt die Bildung der **Verneinung** und der **Frage nicht** mit **to do**.

to have als Vollverb mit **to do**



to have als Hilfsverb ohne **to do**

*I **don't live** in London. **Do I have** enough money for the bus?
You **don't make** your homework carefully. **Do you make** your homework carefully enough?
Boris **doesn't like** hot chocolate. **Does Boris like** hot chocolate?
Theresa **doesn't love** ice-cream. **Does Theresa love** ice-cream?
Today it **doesn't rain** in Dublin. **Does it always rain** in Dublin?
We **don't want** to drink with the sandwich. **Do we have** enough to drink for the party?
You **don't work** hard enough for your business. **Do you work** hard enough for your business?
They **don't travel** by train. **Do they never travel** by train?*

*He **can't** help me. - **Can he** help me?
Boris **must not** forget his homework. - **Must he** get up early?
Theresa **may not** go to the cinema. - **May she** watch TV?
You **should not** drink so much. - **Should I** invite Nigel?*

*They **don't have** the time to visit London.
Do I have enough money for the bus?*

*She **hasn't seen** her father for ten years.
Has he repaired his car?*
